By minute 26/3/21 of 20th February described a proposal to send a small party of British civilian intercept operators to N. Borneo to improve Signit collection from Borneo torrets, and referred also to the possibility that the U.K. might stek AS7 help in secting any requirement for field digint or "F" in Borneo. These matters were subsequently discussed here and in Camberra during the visit of Mr. Hooper (Deputy Director, Golds) in North, when it was noted that :-

- (a) arrangements had been made for placing a one-term intercept party (totalling six personnel) in Labran, composed of British civilians
- (b) the War Office had decided to form a British Army
 "Y" troop, consisting of one teem of norme
 operators plus Traffic-analysis staff and one
 officer qualified in Malay but requiring training
 in the Indonesian language. This "roop would be
 despatched to the Far Sast when requested by
 FARMS"
- (c) the question of whother the U.K., would approach
 the Australian Covernment on the possible
 provision of an ARF "Y" unit to support COMMAINTON
 Borneo would be decided later; such an approach,
 if eade, would probably be through the 600 and the
 British Righ Commissioner in Comberns.

2. The civilian party (1(a) above) was established in labuan early in April, and is making a very useful contribution by the collection of Signit from targets in East Malimantan which are partly or shelly insudible

The administrative and demostic conditions are however unsuitable for continued operation on a civilian basis and it is envisaged that the party will be relieved, as soon as precitable, by the British ray Proop (1(b) above), which has assenting been despatched to singupour and is under training at the cain intercept station there.

- 3. The capability of the British Troop will be limited primarily to collection, on the relatively small scale of one intercept temms the British army has no personnel experienced in the linguistic and other specialised processing skills required to produce Sigint from Indonesian intercept.
- We have now been informed that the CHO has been asked to forward to the Australian Sovernment a request for Auf help in the provision of "I" support in Borneo. We understand that the present Wak. draft mentions an "ideal" requirement for a self-contained AUF "Y" unit of up to 4 teams with its own vehicles and equipment, to which the British Army unit could be attached, but goes on to may that, should that he found impossible.
- 5. I will be glad to provide any additional information which may be required in connection with this matter; for the moment, however, it would seem that any further action should await the formal approach being made through the British High Considerioner.
